PLANT 486 Gallery is pleased to present <u>Second Story</u>, a solo exhibition of new drawings by Scott Teplin. This is Teplin's first presentation at PLANT 486 Gallery, and will be on view October, 26th through November, 30th.

For his sixteenth solo exhibition Teplin has expanded on his architectural drawings to incorporate impossible elements reminiscent of <u>Oscar Reutersvärd</u>, M.C. Escher and <u>Roger Penrose</u>. At first glance one might simply see the structures as inventive diagrams. Upon further inspection, viewers begin to discern the illogical nature of the depicted spaces. The pen & ink and watercolor work in the show, all created in 2023, includes a 37" x 47" drawing, six 14" x 14" drawings and a set of twenty 5" x 7" finished studies.

Artist Statement

Brooklyn based, interdisciplinary artist Scott Teplin creates paintings, drawings, and prints that merge possible and impossible elements of space, objects and anatomy. Humorous, grotesque, and whimsical, Teplin calls on a wellspring of childhood memories and feelings to return viewers to a place of innocence and uncertainty; where anything and everything is possible and believable. Teplin is drawn to the variability, warmth and imperfect line quality that a steel-nib dip pen lends to his work. His obsessive layering of color emphasizes the illusion of depth, inviting viewers to wonder what's around the next corner.


Teplin's meticulously rendered, labyrinthine buildings offer an invitation for viewers to navigate on their own playful terms. In this series, which began in the early 1990's, Teplin has merged the tight boundary of isometric composition with the boundless personality that inhabits the space. More recently Teplin's isometric works have stretched the margins further by incorporating impossible elements resulting in optical sensations of depth.

Biography

Scott Teplin had a fun but restless youth in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. While he largely avoided art classes, he began to shape his creative identity early on through other boundary testing endeavors like making fireworks and sewing his own eccentric outfits. These early playful, imaginative, and often risky pursuits continue to inform his work today.

Discovering the medium of watercolor as a viewer and emerging artist during a year of study in Europe was transformative for Teplin. The challenge of capturing a viewer's attention and drawing them into his imagination through this capricious medium was immediately exciting to him. This set him on a path that gained footing through a BS at the University of Wisconsin, Madison and an MFA in printmaking at the University of Washington.

Teplin has exhibited world-wide in Museums and commercial galleries since 1998. His work is included in the permanent collections of Museum of Modern Art (NY and SF), The New Museum, Brooklyn Museum of Art, Spencer Art Museum, Walker Art Center, Smithsonian Institution, Altoids Collection, New York Public Library, Phoenix Public Library, MIT, University of Virginia, Cornell University, Harvard University, Yale University, University of Washington, University of Wisconsin, Wesleyan University, Stanford University, The California College of



Arts and Crafts, University of Iowa, Occidental College, Johns Hopkins Children's Hospital, Turku University Hospital - Finland, Penn and Teller, and Progressive Insurance
